NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on 08 October 2025 U K Insurance Limited ("**UKI**") and Intact Insurance UK Limited ("**IIUK**") applied to the High Court of Justice of England and Wales (the "**Court**"), pursuant to section 107(1) of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 (the "**Act**"), for an Order under section 111(1) of the Act sanctioning an insurance business transfer scheme (the "**Scheme**") for the transfer to IIUK of certain general insurance business carried on by UKI (the "**Transferring Business**") and for the making of ancillary orders in connection with the implementation of the Scheme under sections 112 and 112A of the Act.

The Transferring Business comprises insurance policies written by UKI under the "NIG" and "Farmweb" brands and certain broker brands (including relevant distribution agreements and reinsurance agreements covering the Transferring Business).

If the Scheme is sanctioned by the Court, it will result in the transfer to IIUK of all the contracts, property, assets and liabilities comprising the Transferring Business notwithstanding that a person would otherwise be entitled to terminate, modify, acquire or claim an interest or right or to treat an interest or right as terminated or modified in respect thereof. Any such entitlement will only be enforceable to the extent the order of the Court makes provision to that effect. Accordingly, unless otherwise provided for in the Scheme, payments in respect of the policies comprising the Transferring Business shall, upon the transfer becoming effective, be dealt with by IIUK. If you are in any doubt as to whether your insurance policy is included in the proposed transfer, please contact UKI using the contact details below.

The application is due to be heard at 7 Rolls Building, Fetter Lane, London, EC4A 1NL on 25 February 2026. If approved by the Court, it is currently proposed that the Scheme will take effect at 00:01 (London time) on 1 April 2026.

Any person who thinks that they would be adversely affected by the carrying out of the Scheme has a right to attend the hearing and express their views either in person or through a legal representative.

Any person intending to attend is requested (but is not obliged) to give notice of such intention as soon as possible and preferably at least five business days before the hearing on 25 February 2026, setting out their grounds of objection to UKI by calling the above number or by writing to the address above or to the solicitors named below.

Any person who thinks that they would be adversely affected by the Scheme but does not intend to attend the hearing may also make representations about the Scheme by giving notice of such representations, as soon as possible and preferably at least five business days before the hearing on 25 February 2026, by calling the above number or by writing to the address above or to the solicitors named below.
